Text choices for both standards will reflect appropriate cultural contexts, for example German-speaking communities, te ao Māori, the Pacific, and Aotearoa New Zealand. Texts will refer to events or experiences that are familiar and relevant to the candidate.

In Level 1 German examinations, candidates can respond in English or te reo Māori.
