Candidates are required to use specific and relevant evidence to support their analysis. An analysis requires the explanation of influences, consequences, and strategies.

Teaching and learning should focus on the knowledge of adolescent health issues and how the underlying concepts of health can be applied to any given context. Candidate responses should provide evidence of their knowledge from their own course of study. Candidates should focus on the quality of their responses rather than the length.
