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## National Diploma in Print Industry Management (Level 5)

**Level** 5

**Credits** 120

### Purpose

The Diploma in Print Industry Management (Level 5) [Ref: 1377] is an advanced qualification designed for people who are employed in management within the print industry.

The qualification is made up of a compulsory section, and two elective sections.

The compulsory section enables candidates to carry out research and report on the print industry.

The first elective section gives the candidate the flexibility to select further credits from the *Printing, Business Operations and Development*, and *Manufacturing Skills* domains.

The second elective section recognises the wide range of specialisation within the print industry by including skills from the *Business, Education, Humanities, Manufacturing and Service Sector* fields.

This qualification has credits in common with the National Certificate in Print Industry Management (Level 4) [Ref: 0912] and the National Certificate in Print Industry Management (Level 5) [Ref: 1376]. This allows candidates to enter this qualification directly or to build on earlier achievements.

## Transition Arrangements

### Version 2

Version 2 was issued following a revision to make the qualification more achievable.

Changes to structure and content

- The expiring *Printing Administration* domain has been removed from Set 1, Elective 1 and an exemption added.
- The *Delivery of Adult Education and Training*, *Assessment of Learning*, *Retail and Distribution Core Skills*, *Sales Transactions* and *Service Sector - Core Skills* domains were added to Elective 2.
- The *Communication Skills* subfield was added to Elective 2.
