### Purpose

The National Diploma in Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora (Pae Tuawhā) (Level 6) [Ref: 1641] recognises a range of Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora competencies that acknowledge achievement in the production aspects of tāniko, and weaving in general. It is primarily intended for people who have, or aspire to acquire, an advanced level of knowledge and skills in the practical side of tāniko, as well as conducting research for a Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora kaupapa.

This qualification will provide graduates with the knowledge and skills of a broad base of practical competence and increased specialisation in Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora, in a contemporary context. Other possible pathways include further study towards New Zealand qualifications in Visual Arts or Fine Arts.

This qualification is a further pathway for people who have met the requirements of the National Certificate in Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora (Pae Tuatahi (Level 2) [Ref: 0705], the National Certificate in Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora (Pae Tuarua) (Level 4) [Ref: 0706], and/or the National Diploma in Ngā Mahi ā te Whare Pora (Pae Tuatoru) (Level 5) [Ref: 1640].
