3. Apply knowledge of basic reo to everyday use and develop respect for te reo as an expression of mana reo.
4. Use te reo at a basic level to achieve tasks in familiar contexts as an expression of mana ao tūroa.

Rumaki context:

To achieve Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Rumaki) (Te Kaupae 1), graduates must be able to communicate in te reo at the appropriate level in a familiar Māori language immersion context to meet the outcomes.

Reo Rua context:

To achieve Te Pōkaitahi Reo (Reo Rua) (Te Kaupae 1), graduates must be able to communicate in te reo at the appropriate level in a familiar bi-lingual context to meet the outcomes.
