Graduates of the **High Ropes strand** will also be able to:

 plan, prepare for, organise and lead traversing and climbing high ropes activities.

Graduates of the High Wire strand will also be able to:

 plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory high wire activities.

Graduates of the **Sea Kayaking strand** will also be able to:

plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory sea kayaking activities on flat-water.

Graduates of the **Sit-on-top Kayaking strand** will also be able to:

 plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory sit-on-top kayaking activities on flat-water.

Graduates of the Whitewater Kayaking strand will also be able to:

 plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory whitewater kayaking activities on flat-water.

Education pathway

This qualification can build on from the New Zealand Certificate in Outdoor Experiences (Level 3) [Ref: 2570], or the New Zealand Certificate in Assistant Outdoor Leadership (Level 3) [Ref: 3658].

This qualification provides a pathway to the New Zealand Certificate in

Outdoor Leadership (Guiding) (Level 5) with strands in Bush, Caving, Mountain Biking (Grade 4), National Raft Guide (Grade III), National Raft Guide (Grade IV/V), National River Boarding Guide (Grade III), National River Boarding Guide (Grade IV/V), and Rock Climbing [Ref: 3660], and the New Zealand Certificate in Outdoor Leadership (Instruction) (Level 5) with strands in Alpine, Bush, Caving Streamway, Education Outside The Classroom (EOTC), Mountain Biking (Grade 4), Rock Climbing, Canoeing, High Ropes, Sea Kayaking, and Whitewater Kayaking [Ref: 3661].

Employment pathway

This qualification could lead to paid, volunteer or self-employment as an Outdoor Leader or Adventure Activity Guide in one of the specialised activities for a range of organisations providing outdoor instruction or experiences. This may include roles such as a Raft Guide, Climbing Wall Supervisor, Cave Streamway Guide, Education Outside The Classroom (EOTC) Leader, or Mountain Biking guide.

Qualification award This qualification may be awarded by any organisation with an approved programme of study or industry training leading to this qualification. **Evidence requirements for** All Tertiary Education Organisations (TEOs) will be required to provide assuring consistency evidence during the consistency process to demonstrate how graduates have met the graduate profile. Evidence relevant to this qualification must include the following: industry feedback; self-evaluation (e.g. programme evaluation reports, moderation outcomes); graduate feedback; graduate progression/destination information; relevant learning experience undertaken in an outdoor recreation environment that includes logged hours of experience captured in logbooks and workplace verification; portfolio of relevant experience including learner self-evaluation (where appropriate). - relevant Activity Safety Guidelines published by Worksafe New Zealand;
- industry Codes including the Snow Responsibility Code, the Outdoor Safety Code and 'Leave No Trace' principles;
- a recognised and approved safety management system including organisational policies and procedures including Emergency Action Plans (EAPs), Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs), and the use of personal protective equipment (PPE);
- relevant industry publications.

Abseil strand

4 Specialise in carrying out single pitch abseiling, including abseil rescue skills.

Credits 8

Plan for, and lead groups in the abseiling skills required for a positive introductory experience, including appropriate use and care of equipment.

Credits 12

Programmes must include:

 at least 10 personal abseils at a minimum of three sites abseiling off their own abseil set up and at least five days additional experience as a co-leader or assistant leader, providing assistance with the setup and management of group abseils at a crag and/or abseil structure.

Sites must meet the following parameters:

- there is non-technical access for the participant to the abseil and the site allows for simple participant management;
- the setup is on fixed anchors, trees or threads; and the Leader has visited the site previously and had their set up approved by a Level 5 Rock Instructor or Level 6 Senior Instructor; and Personal Safety can be set up simply using fixed anchors; and the ground at the base of the abseiling area is flat and hazard free.

Bush strand

6 Plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory bush walking activities.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

- at least 10 days (each day should be at least four hours duration) experience bush walking;
- at least five days additional experience as a co-leader or assistant leader.

Terrain must meet the following parameters:

- single day trips on clearly formed and marked tracks with bridged river crossings or minor unbridged streams;
- walks may extend to the bush line and could extend above the bush line in good weather conditions and in the absence of snow.

Caving strand

7 Plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory caving activities.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

- at least 10 days caving experience leading/guiding with clients in a supervised role in either guiding or Streamway guiding under the Safety Management System;
- operating in a site specific cave/s within the company SOPs;
- implementing the SOP parameters of when to cancel a trip due to environmental conditions changing.

Education Outside The Classroom strand

Plan, manage and evaluate EOTC activities in outdoor settings to meet New Zealand curriculum objectives.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

 experience as an Assistant Leader on at least five half-day EOTC events and have been a Leader on at least two half-day EOTC events.

Mountain Biking (Grade 2) strand

9 Plan, prepare for, lead and evaluate mountain bike activities in 'front country' terrain on Mountain Bike New Zealand (MTBNZ) Grade 2 trails.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

- personal riding on MTBNZ trails Grade 3 for at least two hours;
- at least 30 hours of riding on trails up to and including MTBNZ trail Grade 3. Selected Grade 3 trails must be within an hour of emergency services and ridden within daylight hours.

Raft Guide (Grade II) strand

10 Specialise in carrying out rafting activities on moving water up to and including Grade II, as a Grade II Raft Guide.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

 at least 10 hours of trips on moving water up to and including Grade II.

Please note: This is a regulated industry and graduates must meet the requirements set out in Maritime New Zealand Rule Part 81.

Graduates will be issued the Raft Guide (Grade II) industry award upon successful completion of this strand.

River Boarding Guide (Grade II) strand

11 Specialise in carrying out river boarding activities on moving water up to and including Grade II, as a River Boarding Guide Grade II.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

 at least 10 hours of river boarding trips on moving water up to and including Grade II.

Graduates will be issued the River Boarding Guide (Grade II) industry award upon successful completion of this strand.

Rock Climbing strand

12 Carry out single pitch rock climbing, including rock climbing rescue skills.

Credits 8

Plan for, and lead groups in the rock climbing skills required for a positive introductory experience, including appropriate use and care of equipment.

Credits 12

Programmes must include:

- climbing, single pitch, on at least 20 routes (any grade) while on a top rope at either indoor or outdoor venues and have at least an additional five days experience as a co-leader or assistant leader, providing assistance with the setup and management of group climbing at indoor and/or outdoor venues;
- top roped climbing to Grade 14.

Sites must meet the following parameters:

- set up single pitch top rope climbs where haul lines are in place and regular checks of anchors are completed by the organisation managing the venue; or there are fixed anchors bollards, trees or threads; and
- where the candidate has visited the site previously and had their set up approved by a Rock Climbing Instructor or senior instructor; and where personal safety can be set up simply using fixed anchors.

Canoeing strand

Plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory canoe activities on flat water.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

- at least 40 hours canoeing experience on flat-water; and
- at least 5 sessions of additional experience as a canoeing coleader or assistant leader. A session is considered to be a minimum of an hour.

Environments must meet the following parameters:

- Lead canoeing activities on flat or sheltered water, including estuaries, river deltas, sheltered beaches, lakes, coastal inlets and swimming pools, when the wind strength and direction do not compromise the safety and purpose of the activity.
- Currents may be present when the flow and the hazards pose no greater risk than flat-water.

High Ropes strand

Plan, prepare for, organise and lead traversing and climbing high ropes activities.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

- At least 10 days experience of high ropes with at least 5 of the days as a high ropes co-leader or assistant leader
- A day is considered to be 4 hours duration and can be made of multiple sessions.

High Wire strand

Plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory high wire activities.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

- At least 10 days experience of high wire with at least 5 of the days as a high wire co-leader or assistant leader.
- A day is considered to be 4 hours duration and can be made of multiple sessions.

Sea Kayaking strand

17 Plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory sea kayaking activities on flatwater.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

- At least 40 hours sea kayaking using a closed deck single or double sea kayak on flat-water and at least 5 sessions additional experience as a co-leader or assistant leader using a closed deck single or double sea kayak.
- A session is considered to be a minimum of an hour.

Environments must meet the following parameters:

- Lead sea kayaking activities on flat or sheltered water, including estuaries, river deltas, sheltered beaches, lakes, coastal inlets and swimming pools, when the wind strength and direction do not compromise the safety and purpose of the activity.
- Currents may be present when the flow and the hazards pose no greater risk than flat-water.

Sit-on-top Kayaking strand

18 Plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory sit-ontop kayaking activities on flatwater.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

- At least 40 hours kayaking using a sit-on-top kayak on flat-water.
- At least 5 sessions additional experience as a co-leader or assistant leader using a sit-on-top kayak. A session is considered to be a minimum of an hour.

Environments must meet the following parameters:

- Lead sit-on-top kayaking activities on flat or sheltered water, including estuaries, river deltas, sheltered beaches, lakes, coastal inlets and swimming pools, when the wind strength and direction do not compromise the safety and purpose of the activity.
- Currents may be present when the flow and the hazards pose no greater risk than flat-water.

Whitewater Kayaking strand

19 Plan, prepare for, organise and lead introductory whitewater kayaking activities on flat-water.

Credits 20

Programmes must include:

- At least 40 hours experience kayaking using a closed whitewater kayak; and
- At least 5 sessions of additional experience as a kayak co-leader or assistant leader on flat or sheltered water using a closed whitewater kayak. A session is considered to be a minimum of one hour.

Environments must meet the following parameters:

 Lead whitewater kayaking activities on flat or sheltered water, including estuaries, river deltas, sheltered beaches, lakes, coastal inlets and swimming pools when the wind direction and strength do not compromise the safety and purpose of the activity. This includes rivers when the flow and the hazards present no greater risk than flat-water.

Replacement information

This qualification replaced:

 National Certificate in Outdoor Recreation (Leadership) with strands in Abseiling, Bush-Walking, Kayaking, Mountain Biking, Rock Climbing, and Sea Kayaking (Level 3) [Ref: 1594].

People currently enrolled in programmes leading to the replaced qualification may either complete the requirements by 31 December 2021 or transfer to this qualification.

The last date for entry into programmes leading to the replaced qualification is 31 December 2019. The last date for assessments to take place for the replaced qualification is 31 December 2021, at which time it will be designated as discontinued.
