#### Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

To achieve this standard, the assessment will be where the person conducting a business or undertaking (PCBU) has provision for a level of supervision to ensure safety of the ākonga and work undertaken.

Basic operation of a small mobile plant includes smooth movement through the vehicle's functions and working range, clearance around obstacles, carrying loads in a safe position, including when reversing, and parking, shutting down and securing the vehicle.

Organisational procedures for the leaving of plant may include identification of issues with plant and actions taken, safety locks.

Small mobile plant refers to machinery under 4500kg. This may include hydraulic excavators, small loaders, skid steers.

The assessment may be carried out on a worksite or in a simulated environment. The small mobile plant may not be used on a public road where a licence endorsement may be required by the driver.

Licence endorsement requirements are specified in the Land Transport (Driver Licensing) Rule 1999, available from <u>www.legislation.govt.nz</u>.

- Types, safe use, and limitations of small mobile plant used in construction, demolition, or infrastructure industries.
- Attachments and controls, and their safe use, for small mobile plant.
- Personal protective equipment (PPE) required for operation of small mobile plant.
- Safety checks before use of small mobile plant, including pre-start and 360 walkaround.
- Operation and maintenance requirements for small mobile plant and attachments.
- Safe load positioning.
- Consequences of unsafe operation of small mobile plant.
- Communications with site personnel, including those required in case of emergency.
- Hazard recording and reporting requirements.
