<b>Whāinga   Purpose</b>	<p>This skill standard introduces learners to the world of podcasting. It covers foundational skills in creating and organising digital content through podcasting, storytelling, fostering digital literacy and practical communication skills.</p> <p>Learners who have completed the standard will be able to create, record, edit, and publish podcasts on video and/or audio, to social media, and cloud platforms.</p>

1. Create an initial outline for a podcast.	a. Research and identify modern podcasters and trends in the online podcasting space.
	b. Develop a podcast outline and produce a basic introduction for your podcast.
2. Create logo for a podcast.	a. Use graphic design software to create a podcast logo.
	b. Use file management and cloud-based storage to archive assets for logo and podcast material.
3. Plan and secure an interview for a podcast.	a. Identify and select an interviewee that aligns with your interests.
	b. Gather information on selected interviewee and develop core questions for the interview.
4. Record and edit an interview for a podcast.	a. Conduct and record an interview using appropriate equipment.
	b. Use editing software to edit and export podcast.
5. Publish finished podcast on cloud or social media platform.	a. Finish podcast by adding introduction B-roll and multiple audio tracks with music.
	b. Publish finished podcast by archiving to cloud storage or releasing to social media.

**Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria****Assessment specifications:**

To complete this standard, learner must create and edit one full podcast interview.

Depending on the situation or context of the conducted interview, learner may need to observe relevant organisational criteria and/or legislation such as the Privacy Act (2020).

For the purposes of this standard, B-roll refers to supplementary footage added as part of the editing process and which enhance the overall narrative or key details of the final podcast.

- Introduction to podcasts in new media.
- Primary graphic and logo design branding through the use of online software.
- Basic introduction to file management, cloud storage and publishing to social media.
- Introduction to podcasting capture equipment, including smartphones, microphones and video cameras.
- Introduction to computer editing software, audio and video editing, including addition of podcast intro and music, and making cuts to remove unwanted footage.
- Communication skills and interview techniques.
- Introduction to relevant legislation for broadcasting, including the Privacy Act (2020) and the Copyright Act (1994).
- Camera technique and presentation skills.
- Digital marketing and online content creation.
