## Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

Candidates must be capable of consistently working safely as a flooring team member under supervision to the current health and safety standards. Performance must reflect relevant workplace requirements, job specific instructions, and accepted standards of behaviour.

*Common hazards* include those frequently encountered in both domestic and commercial environments, including construction sites.

*Moving, handling, and storing* includes contexts that are typical in the flooring trades, for example in and out of vehicles and storage areas.

Assessment may be in a flooring trades workplace or a simulated work environment.

#### Safe working practices in a flooring trades worksite

- Personal protective equipment (PPE) used in the flooring trades, fitting, care, and maintenance.
- Responsibilities of self and others.
- Moving and handling tools and products to avoid injuries such as strains and sprains.
- Storage of tools and products.
- Maintaining a safe working environment cordons, barriers, guards, clear work area.
- Impact of stress, fatigue, drugs, and alcohol.
- Situations in which work can be refused and raising concerns when work may cause injury or ill-health.

#### **Hazard awareness**

- Identifying worksite risks and hazards (situational and task related).
- Identifying asbestos and silica.

#### Working as part of a team

- Understanding the roles of others, and maintaining awareness of others, on a flooring trades worksite.
- Communicating with others and clients, including professional workplace behaviour.
- Following processes to report injuries and near misses.
- Speaking up and asking questions.
