Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

Candidates must be capable of completing basic flooring substrate preparation tasks to current safety standards. Performance must reflect relevant workplace requirements, job specific instructions, and accepted standards of behaviour.

Basic flooring substrate preparation does not include mechanical abrasion of the entire surface or the removal of all surface contaminants.

Minor repairs are small areas that can be remediated by applying a compound filler.

Assessment may be in a flooring trades workplace or a simulated work environment.

Safe working practices

- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for preparation tasks, including care and maintenance of PPF
- Identifying risks and hazards of preparation tasks (situational and task related).
- Moving and handling tools, equipment, and products to avoid strains and sprains.
- Safe use, maintenance, storage, and handling of tools and equipment for preparation tasks.
- Loading and unloading of work vehicles with relevant tools and products.
- Protection against dust, fumes, vibration, and noise.
- Working with electrical equipment.
- Recognising hazardous products and substances, including asbestos and silica.

Removing existing flooring surface material

- The impact of clean and smooth substrates on flooring installation.
- Tools and equipment for substrate preparation tasks.
- Methods to remove different floor coverings: carpet, underlay, vinyl, linoleum, tiles, adhesive, plaster, and paint residue.
- Methods to attend to protruding nails and screws.
- Clean up tasks for removal of existing floor coverings.

Preparing flooring surfaces

- Abrading surfaces with appropriate tools and equipment.
- Scraping and vacuuming substrates.
- Mixing and applying a compound for minor repairs.

- Using basic measurements and ratios for flooring tasks.
- Accessing safety data sheets.
