Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

Candidates must be capable of identifying characteristics of products used for carpet flooring installation which reflect industry best practice guidelines and manufacturers' specifications.

Purpose refers to the application and environment that the product is most suitable for.

Properties refer to the significant attributes of the product that impact installation methods, compatibility with other products and performance of the product over time.

Carpet products

- Types of carpet and their purposes and properties as it impacts installation methods, including ribbing, tufted, woven, carpet tiles, needle punched, flocked.
- Types, purpose, and properties of natural and synthetic carpets.
- Manufacturer's specifications for products and product data sheets.

Underlay products

- Types of underlay and their purposes and properties for bonded and conventional carpet installation.

Consumables

- The properties, functionality and compatibility of products used to finish edges, junctions, joins, changes in planes and height variations.

Adhesives

- Types and properties of adhesives used for bonded carpet, carpet grippers, edging trims, stair nosings, seam sealing, carpet joins, and carpet edges.
- Compatibility of adhesives with other products and substrates.
- Safe storage and disposal of adhesives.

Literacy

- Interpreting product manufacturers' specifications, including product data sheets.
