Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

Candidates must be capable of consistently installing timber flooring product into non-complex single floor areas to commercial standards.

Non-complex refers to a symmetrical regular shaped area. The floor can either be solid timber or engineered timber.

Commercial standards refer to:

- performing the skill in a safe manner
- performing the skill to required industry standards
- performing the skill within an acceptable timeframe
- repeating the skill on demand.

Industry standards must reflect flooring industry best practice, workplace procedures and be within acceptable tolerances as defined in New Zealand.

Workplace procedures refer to verbal and written information covering company policy, standard operating procedures, and job specific instructions.

Assessment must reflect workplace conditions and meet workplace health and safety requirements.

- Personal protective equipment (PPE) for bonding installation tasks.
- Bonded timber installation risk assessment and hazard management.
- Protection against fumes from adhesives.
- Performing bonded timber installation tasks safely.
- Safe use of tools and equipment for bonded timber installation.
- Working with hazardous substances.

Planning work

- Planning and coordinating own tasks and coordinating tasks in conjunction with other trades.
- Establishing work activities and priorities.

Products

- Types and properties of timber and engineered timber flooring.
- Checking the condition of products and observable signs of flaws.
- Manufacturers' specifications for products and product data sheets.

Timber flooring installation techniques

- Assessing substrate moisture and application of moisture barriers.
- Set out of worksite for installation.
- Methods of bonded installation to different substrates.
- Joining engineered timber flooring.
- Sealing edges, expansion gaps and trims, edge finishing.

Measurements and calculations

- Measuring timber flooring products and non-complex room dimensions.
- Calculating area of rooms and amount of product required.
- Sketching and recording dimensions of an installation.

Maintaining site and equipment

- Clearing sites of surplus product, tools, equipment, and debris.
- Cleaning, storing, and maintaining tools.
- Safe disposal of waste products.
