Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

Candidates must be capable of consistently measuring and assessing non-complex sites and producing accurate documentation sufficient for a quote to be prepared to commercial standards.

Environmental conditions include light sources and UV exposure.

Non-complex refers to small to medium sized sites with symmetrically regular shaped flooring areas.

Candidates must be capable of recording site measurements and features for floor covering installation on concrete and timber substrates.

Commercial standards refer to:

- performing the skill in a safe manner
- performing the skill to required industry standards
- performing the skill within an acceptable timeframe
- repeating the skill on demand.

Industry standards must reflect flooring industry best practice, workplace procedures and be within acceptable tolerances as defined in New Zealand.

Workplace procedures refer to verbal and written information covering company policy, standard operating procedures, and job specific instructions.

Assessment must reflect workplace conditions and meet workplace health and safety requirements.

Measurements and working plans

- Making measurements and creating working plans.
- Planning for flooring product layout, including location of joins.
- Installation surface area.
- Lineal product lengths.

Assessing substrates and surroundings

- Evaluating existing floorcoverings and removal requirements.
- Evaluating substrate properties and preparation requirements.
- Evaluating substrate suitability for different flooring products.
- Assessing edges of areas and finishing required.
- Assessing suitability sites, selected product, and environmental conditions such as light sources, UV exposure.
- Procedures if asbestos or silica are identified.

Preparation for installation

- Documenting site assessment for preparation required, installation of products and finishing tasks.
- Evaluating worksite hazards and on-site risks.
- Safe access and delivery of materials on the worksite.
- Relevant legislation, building codes, industry best practice, and manufacturers' specifications.

Professional communication

- Discussing job requirements during measuring and site assessment.
- Explaining requirements for safety, clearing the area, access to site, and disconnection of fixed electrical appliances.
- Presenting and discussing a plan and layout.
- Communicating with clients.
