Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

Candidates must be capable of consistently installing loop, cut, and patterned carpet by conventional method to concrete and timber substrates to the standards expected of commercial competence.

Assessment must include fitting, carpet gripper, power stretching, joining, trimming, tucking and edging carpets to flooring surfaces and stairs.

Commercial competence refers to:

- performing the skill in a safe manner
- performing the skill to required industry standards
- performing the skill within a commercially viable timeframe
- repeating the skill on demand
- performing the skill without supervision
- applying the skill to other work.

Industry standards must reflect flooring industry best practice, workplace procedures, and be within acceptable tolerances as defined in New Zealand.

Workplace procedures refer to verbal and written information covering company policy, standard operating procedures, and job specific instructions.

Assessment must conform to workplace conditions and meet workplace health and safety requirements.

- Interpreting and using a cutting plan.
- Measuring and cutting.
- Fitting and forming.
- Stretching and tensioning.
- Installing on stairs.
- Carpet gripper, and edge finishing.
