Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

Candidates must be capable of consistently applying finishes to complex flooring areas to the standards expected of commercial competence.

Complex refers to sites with medium to large or irregular shaped flooring areas.

Commercial competence refers to:

- performing the skill in a safe manner
- performing the skill to required industry standards
- performing the skill within a commercially viable timeframe
- repeating the skill on demand
- performing the skill without supervision
- applying the skill to other work.

Finishes refer to moisture curing, waterborne, water based, polyurethane, wax, stain, oil.

Industry standards must reflect flooring industry best practice, workplace procedures, and be within acceptable tolerances as defined in New Zealand.

Job documentation refers to all documentation relevant to a specific agreed timber flooring work programme.

Workplace procedures refer to verbal and written information covering company policy, standard operating procedures, and job specific instructions.

The timber flooring product will either be solid timber or engineered timber.

Assessment must conform to workplace conditions and meet workplace health and safety requirements.
