Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

Evidence for implementation of compliance practices must reflect the expectations of a tradesperson, not or a supervisor, project manager or architect/engineer.

Compliance requirements for construction trades refer to adherence with warranties, liabilities, manufacturer's specifications, consumer guarantees, Standards and Codes and/or consenting relevant to work undertaken. Consenting processes relate to both national and local regulations and Codes.

A *construction environment* is any environment where construction, modification, or maintenance of buildings, structures, or infrastructure assets takes place.

It is not a requirement to be a Licenced Building Practitioner (LBP) to carry out restricted building work; it is required that work requiring consent is supervised and signed off by an LBP.
