Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria*Assessment specifications:*

Candidates must be capable of consistently interpreting information in plans and documentation for specific construction tasks.

Assessment must include evidence for specific construction tasks within a wider construction work programme or a small construction job.

Dimensions refer to all measurements related to specific construction programme tasks and may include site layout.

Documentation refers to specifications, manufacturer's instructions, architectural and engineering drawings, and other detailed information required to complete the planned tasks.
