Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

For assessment purposes:

Assessments should reflect the context of Aotearoa and the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi, contemporary overarching acts, positive youth development frameworks, including Mana Taiohi and *Code of Ethics for Youth Work in Aotearoa New Zealand*.

Definitions:

- *Positive youth development* is an approach or philosophy that guides communities in the way they organise services, supports, and opportunities so that all young people can develop to their full potential.

- *Taiohi* refers to young people between 12 and 24 years of age.
- *Te ao Māori* is the Māori world view that acknowledges the interconnectedness and interrelationships of all living and non-living things.
- *Te Tiriti o Waitangi* is the historic agreement between the British Crown and Māori in New Zealand to establish a common set of laws or agreements for the British settlers and Māori people to live together. It has two texts: one in English and one in te reo Māori.
- *Tikanga* is a Māori concept that refers to the correct way of doing things within Māori society. It is based on Māori knowledge, values and practices and encompasses various aspects of culture, customs, ritual, and etiquette.
