Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

The candidate must be capable of preparing application area and materials and applying paint using spray methods to substrate surfaces in accordance with worksite requirements.

Evidence is required of application on any two of the following substrate surfaces:

- timber
- steel
- plaster board.

Spray methods refers to the techniques or processes used to apply the spray which may include techniques related to angle, distance and motion.

To achieve this standard the candidate must be capable of consistently:

- performing the skill in a safe manner
- performing the skill to the required industry standard
- performing the skill in an environmentally sustainable manner
- repeating the skill on demand.

Technical skills and knowledge

- Interpreting spray painting project instructions.
- Health and Safety considerations.
- Common hazards associated with spray painting, such as exposure to toxic fumes, skin contact with chemicals, and fire risks.
- Use of appropriate PPE for respiratory protection and protective clothing.
- Protection of adjoining surfaces to application area.
- Spray painting materials plants, equipment, tools, and accessories.
- Mixing process and paint viscosity.
- Application to different substrates surfaces.
- Spraying doors, windows, skirtings, walls.
- Manufacturer's product data specifications.
- Safety requirements, including protection of surfaces against overspray/dust and ventilation management.
- Checking tools and equipment for serviceability and security.
- Reinstalling doors and windows.
- Communication, literacy, and numeracy.
- Required types and standards of documentation.
- Project communication.
