## **Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu** | Assessment information and grade criteria Assessment specifications:

The candidate must be capable of presenting prepared colour schemes for interior and exterior building painting projects to the standards expected of a commercially competent painter.

Commercial competence requires a candidate to be capable of consistently performing the requirements:

- to current regulatory, industry and commercial standards
- within a commercially viable timeframe
- in commercial environments
- without supervision
- in different and unfamiliar contexts.

*Environment* refers to and may include architectural style, location, immediate surroundings, size, configuration and intended function of the surface to be painted, the surface type and quality, any intended visual effects, and light level and intensity.

- Use of interior and exterior spaces, harmony, discordance, pattern, texture to define the relationship between colours and environment.
- Manufacturer's product data specifications.
- Environmental effects on colour, including architectural style, location, immediate surroundings, size, configuration and intended function of the surface to be painted, the surface type and quality, any intended visual effects, and light level and intensity.

#### Communication, literacy and numeracy

- Required types and standards of documentation.
- Communicating and presenting colour schemes.
- Clarifying client project instructions.
