- kai Māori preservation reasons may include seasonal availability, lean seasons, upcoming events and trading purposes.
- whānau, hapū and iwi environment working together for an event, an occasion, organising, contribution and participation.
- kōrero tuku iho is used in relation to Māori stories, or Māori histories and can be found in oral traditions for example ngā pūrākau, pakiwaitara, whakapapa, karakia, waiata, karanga, whai kōrero or in written literature, concepts, whakataukī and whakatauākī.
- basic use of te reo and kai Māori karakia.
- marae environmental and kaitiakitanga activities.
- kawa me tikanga, health and safety.
