### Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

#### *Assessment specifications:*

Candidates must demonstrate competence for this skill standard while undertaking at least one project. Projects at this level can be prescribed, with a focus on industry entry-level skills, using a range of techniques and tools to achieve the project requirements.

*Trade information* relates to symbols, terminology, and phrases as they relate to the BCATS project for:

- progression of tasks,
- health and safety,
- project quality control procedures, and
- consideration of the environment.

*Relevant parties* to the project may include other people in the work area, the trainer.

It is expected that project documentation will be provided to learners.

- Symbols, terminology, jargon and phrases used in a construction trade.
- Material specifications.
- Project documentation.
- Appropriate communication methods in the BCATS environment, and details to be confirmed.
- Appropriate sources of information related to BCATS projects.
- Practices and procedures related to communication in the BCATS environment.
