BCATS environment refers to any workplace or context where work or activities related to building, construction, and allied trades sectors take place, such as school workshops, training establishments, outdoor areas and industry placement workplaces.

BCATS project documentation may include sketches, scale drawings, cutting list, flow chart of actions, summative photos, diaries, project evaluation.
