Assessment specifications:

Candidates must demonstrate competence for this skill standard while undertaking a project. Projects at this level should reflect a focus on industry entry-level skills and complexity, using a wide range of techniques and strategies, materials and equipment.

Candidates may complete the assessment requirements individually or as a group member working on a larger project. If participating in a group, candidates must demonstrate skill for all assessment criteria to be deemed competent.

Evidence of techniques used for collaboration should be provided by the candidate and may be in the form of a brief written or recorded statement, toolbox minutes with important points highlighted and examples of negotiation, decisions made, and responses from others that informed project progression.

Collaboration involves working with others to produce or create something. It may include negotiating with or assisting a classmate with their project, working in a large group toward a common outcome, or other interactions of a similar nature.

Project requirements may refer to progression of tasks, required quality checks and standard of finishing, project timelines, health and safety, and environmental considerations.
