Assessment specifications:

Projects at this level should reflect a focus on industry entry-level skills and complexity, using a wide range of techniques and strategies, materials, and equipment.

Candidates may complete the assessment requirements individually or as a group member working on a larger project. If participating in a group, candidates must demonstrate skill for all assessment criteria to be deemed competent.

Evidence must include a range of BCATS trades other than those of focus for the candidate. They may include others in the project team, other trades, suppliers, health and safety supervisor, or project supervisors.

Construction processes are those that occur onsite.

Production processes are those that occur within a factory or workshop setting.

Suppliers refers to those that provide materials, skills, labour, components.
