- Overview and key features of a handheld or base-set communication device.
- Basic radio operations.
- Correct procedures to power on/off the device, adjust volume, and select the appropriate communication channel for the situation.
- Protocols and etiquette.
- Communicating under difficult conditions – poor radio reception or difficult environmental conditions such as noise, rain, snow, or wind.
- Practical communication skills.
- Troubleshooting basic Issues – fault with device or fault with system, repeaters, relays, and environmental factors that interfere with the PACE framework.
- Safety considerations.
