Assessment specifications:

To achieve this standard, the candidate must test streetscape paving for quality and durability in line with industry standards.

Industry standards must reflect best practice, workplace procedures, and be within acceptable tolerances as defined in New Zealand codes, standards and regulations.

Evidence for this standard must be demonstrated:

- to current and relevant legislation, standards and codes (including safety),
- in an environmentally sustainable manner,
- within an acceptable timeframe,
- in different and unfamiliar contexts,
- with acceptable behaviours.

Definition

Streetscape paving refers to the use of different paving materials in public spaces such as sidewalks, plazas, pedestrian zones, parks and road edges. The focus is on durability, safety, aesthetics and functionality to make these areas accessible and attractive.

- Industry standards.
- Tools and techniques for checking surface level, fall, and straightness.
- Tolerance guidelines for different paving systems.
- Use of lasers, stringlines, spirit levels, and straightedges.

- Issues may include efflorescence, movement, staining, sand loss, cracking, joint erosion or surface unevenness.
- Joint controls and their role in maintaining paving durability, appearance, and function.
- Basic testing for bedding and compaction quality.
- Documentation methods for quality assurance (QA) results and site reporting.
- Communication of QA concerns and solutions.
- Methods for cutting pavers.
