Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria Assessment specifications:

- Assessment must comply with the current version of First Aid as a Life Skill, available from Toitū
 Te Waiora at https://toitutewaiora.nz/first-aid-as-a-life-skill/.
- Competence must be demonstrated in a simulated emergency situation. Environmental conditions must be identified and considered for the situation where assessment takes place.
- Assessment against criterion 1a must include evidence of managing a collapsed adult or child, and an infant.
- Assessment against criterion 1a must include the *Dangers, Response, Send for help, Airway, Breathing, CPR, Defibrillation* (DRSABCD) mnemonic, including checking for scene safety, assessing responsiveness, sending for help, opening and checking the airway, checking for breathing, performing Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), and demonstrating use of an Automated External Defibrillator (AED).
- Assessment against criterion 1b must include evidence of the management of a foreign body airway obstruction for either an adult or child, and an infant.
- Assessment against criterion 1c must include use of a tourniquet.
- Assessment against criterion 1d must include demonstration of placing a collapsed person who
 is unresponsive and breathing normally in the stable-side/recovery position.

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Definitions

- Adult is defined as aged eight years or over.
- Child is defined as aged between one and eight years of age.
- *Infant* is defined as younger than one year old.
- Basic life support is that phase of emergency care that either:
 - a. prevents respiratory or circulatory arrest or insufficiency through prompt recognition or intervention; or.
 - b. supports the person to relieve an airway obstruction; or,
 - c. supports the breathing and circulation of a person with chest compressions and ventilations (CPR) and supports the person through accessing an AED where available.

- CPR through chest compressions and ventilations.
- Use of an AED.

- Stable-side/recovery position.
