Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

The level of expertise required in this skill standard is that of a beginner rather than that expected of people who use these daily.

A minimum of ten times must be converted between the 24-hour and the 12-hour systems, Coordinated Universal Time (UTC), New Zealand Standard Time (NZST), and New Zealand Daylight Time (NZDT). All times are to be given in 4-digit groups (such as 0930Z).

The complete alphabet must be converted into the phonetic alphabet.

Radio communications of times and time periods must be communicated as per the Civil Aviation Authority's Advisory Circular (AC) 172-1.
