2. Work with established practices in a construction environment.	a. Work practices are adjusted to accommodate planned project sequencing.
	b. Site roles, responsibilities, and reporting lines in the construction environment are followed consistently.
	c. Punctuality and communication practices are used to support consistent workflow in a construction environment.

Pārongo aromatawai me te taumata paearu | Assessment information and grade criteria

Assessment specifications:

Candidates must be capable of consistently maintaining an organised work area and following established practices when working in a construction environment while completing a project under supervision.

Projects at this level should reflect a focus on industry entry-level skills and complexity, using a wide range of techniques and strategies, materials, and equipment.

Evidence for this standard must be demonstrated:

- to current and relevant Legislation, Standards, and Codes (including safety),
- in an environmentally sustainable manner,
- with acceptable behaviours.

Definitions:

Acceptable behaviours refer to professional behaviours expected in a construction environment. This includes working safely with others, communicating effectively, following workplace procedures, respecting people, tools, equipment, and materials, and responding appropriately to hazards and changing work conditions.

A *construction environment* is any environment where construction, modification, or maintenance of buildings, structures, or infrastructure assets takes place.
