Whāinga Purpose	This skill standard is for people who are working as drinking water treatment operators. People with this skill can analyse drinking water treatment performance, determine operational responses to maintain compliance, and evaluate how operational actions affect plant assets and operating costs. This skill standard aligns with the New Zealand Certificate in Drinking Water Treatment Operations (Level 4) with optional strands in Pre-Treatment, Clarification, Coagulation and Flocculation, Non-Chlorine Disinfection, Fluoridation, and Filtration [Ref: 5672] and may also contribute to other water services industry credentials.

Assessment specifications:

Ākonga must not be assessed as asset managers but must demonstrate how their operational actions influence asset performance, condition and cost.

Evidence that must take place in a site-specific operational wastewater treatment context.

Definitions

Operational requirements refer to the documented and embedded ways of working that govern how activities are planned, performed, monitored, and controlled in the workplace to ensure safe, consistent, and compliant operations.

Water services refer to industries responsible for working on or around water supplies, networks, plants, and systems.
