



## Sea Survival and Sea Safety Domain

- Range statements were updated for standards 12309, 12310, and 15028.
- Entry information was revised to reflect the current standard titles.
- Titles of standards were amended to align with the changes to the elements and/or to ensure clear relationship to the domain for standards 12309, 12310, and 15028.
- Two standards in this domain were designated expiring as they had not been used and there was no expected future usage.
- Standards 6914 and 6915 in this domain were replaced to reflect changes in industry practice.
