

## **CMR for Building and Construction [Ref: 0048]**

### **Revision of *Building and Construction Industry Training Organisation* CMR**

The Building and Construction Industry Training Organisation (BCITO) has completed the revision of the Consent and Moderation Requirements (CMR) above.

#### **Date new version published**

**August 2011**

The next CMR review is planned to take place during 2014.

#### **Summary of revision**

The reasons for the revision were to:

- update terminology used for consistency with NZQA's change from AMAP to CMR
- include the subfield *Masonry* in the scope of the CMR as per BCITO's extension of coverage
- remove Criterion 8 from the 'Industry or sector-specific requirements for consent to assess' section as it is adequately covered in the 'General requirements for accreditation' section
- make minor modifications to the moderation information to account for the phasing in of moderation selection based on the previous year's results reported.

#### **Compliance with new requirements**

Moderation requirements will apply with effect from September 2011.

Organisations with consent to assess will be expected to be able to demonstrate compliance with the CMR from February 2012 onwards.

#### **Main changes**

##### Requirements for Consent to Assess (RCA)

Industry or sector-specific requirements for consent to assess

- Criterion 8 – requirement for applicant organisations to periodically provide BCITO and employers with reports on student performance and progress was removed.

##### Moderation Requirements (MR)

##### Moderation System

- Unit standards will generally be selected for moderation from those assessed against and reported in the previous year.
- Organisations with consent to assess are expected to retain samples of assessed learner work that can be sent for moderation if requested.
- For organisations assessing against standards at Level 5 and above, the ITO will facilitate an annual cluster moderation meeting of assessors.
- BCITO will continue to negotiate alternatives with organisations in cases in which there is a problem in sending the requested samples.
