Summary of review and consultation process

During 2011 and 2012, a mandatory sector review of qualifications for Resource Efficiency occurred. The review encompassed broad consultation with industry and training provider stakeholders to ensure that the new qualifications meet current and future needs.

The review resulted in a recommendation that the national qualifications listed above should each be replaced by New Zealand qualifications, in order to continue to meet stakeholder needs.

The existing national qualifications have been replaced by New Zealand qualifications, as detailed below.
