Community Support Services ITO Limited (Careerforce) has completed the review of the qualifications listed above.

Replacement qualification

The next qualification review is planned to take place during 2019.

Summary of the review and consultation process

The New Zealand Certificate in Cleaning (Level 3) with optional strands in Specialist Cleaning and Supervision [Ref: 3025] resulted from a review of education and employment pathways for cleaners as part of the Targeted Review of Qualifications (TRoQ). The review process included an analysis of industry learning needs and consultation with providers and industry. The need for a level 3 qualification in cleaning, building on the New Zealand Certificate in Cleaning (Level 2) with optional endorsement in Health Care Facilities Cleaning [Ref: 2316] was agreed by the cleaning industry.

Main changes resulting from the review

The previous three Level 3 and one Level 4 qualifications have been replaced by a single qualification with optional strands. The 'Specialist Cleaning' optional strand allows for a variety of specialisms to be included in training programmes leading to the qualification. The replacement qualification comprises a lower credit requirement for completion than each of the qualifications being replaced: 40 - 50 credits down from 53 - 66.

Transition

The last date for award of the replaced qualifications is 31 December 2017.
