

FIELD Animal Product Examination**Review of *Animal Product Examination* qualification****New Zealand Certificate in Meat Processing (Animal Product Examination) (Level 5) with strands in Nominated Person Inspector-in-Charge or Rover Inspector [Ref: 3673]**

The Primary ITO has completed the review of the qualification listed above.

Date new versions published**November 2017**

The next qualification review is planned to take place during 2022.

Summary of review and consultation process

Primary ITO has reviewed the above qualification because the Ministry of Primary Industry (MPI) changed the requirements for the Rover Inspector roleholder, which affected the achievability of this strand. Both MPI and AsureQuality were consulted and confirmed the need for this change.

Main changes resulting from the review

- The requirement to carry out ante-mortem examination has been removed from the graduate outcome of Rover-Inspector strand. There are no changes to the qualification title.
