Summary of review

NZQA National Qualifications Services have reviewed the CMR as part of a regular maintenance cycle to ensure it is relevant and current.

Compliance with new requirements

Moderation system requirements will apply with effect from October 2019.

Organisations with consent to assess will be expected to be able to demonstrate compliance with the CMR from April 2020 onwards.

Main changes

Requirements for Consent to Assess (RCA)

Industry or sector-specific requirements for consent to assess

 A note referring to the application of Te Hono o te Kahurangi framework application to standards classified under Field Māori was added.

Moderation Requirements (MR)

This section was revised to:

- Reference the new NZQA business unit, Monitoring and Assessment.
- Provide information about the responsibilities and contact details of the NZQA business units involved in the National External Moderation process.
- Reflect on-line access to the moderation system.
- Add reference, under the *Moderation Plan* section, for schools relating to the mandatory selection of standards by NZQA.
- Provide updated links to documents.
- Make changes to school and Tertiary Education Organisation (TEO) submission timeframes.
- Provide further information around samples submitted for standards with more than one grade.

Reporting

The process for annual reporting summaries was updated for TEOs.

Funding

 Reference to exclusions for funding for NZQA Best Practice Workshops and additional moderator support was added. • The rate charged for additional support or activities was increased to reflect the fees rate introduced on 1 July 2018.
