The next CMR review is planned to take place during December 2025.

Summary of review

MITO has reviewed the requirements for consent to assess and moderation requirements for all sectors in its coverage to reflect MITOs' current organisational structure and moderation practice.

Compliance with new requirements

Requirements for consent to assess will apply with effect from December 2020.

Moderation system requirements will apply with effect from December 2020.

Organisations with consent to assess will be expected to be able to demonstrate compliance with the CMR from June 2021 onwards.

Main changes

- References to NZ Transport Agency were updated to refer to its new name Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency.
- References to the Health and Safety in Employment Act 1992 were replaced with the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.
- References to the Industrial Coatings and Petrochemical Industry subfields, which are no longer in MITO's coverage have been removed.

Requirements for Consent to Assess (RCA)

Standard Setting Body involvement in process for granting consent to assess
