### Guidance Information

- 1 Whakapapa must connect to the identified Māori female ancestor with the land interests.
- 2 Sources of information may include but is not limited to –
  - Land Information New Zealand (LINZ)
  - Māori Land Court (Māori land records)
  - Land Information Memoranda reports produced by local councils
  - Own whānau, hapū records.

### Outcomes and performance criteria

#### Outcome 1

Research a land interest of a Māori female ancestor.

Range may include but is not limited to – individual block, land incorporation, tribal holding, iwi land interest.

#### Performance criteria

- 1.1 Original owner(s) of the specified land interest is identified.
  - Range individual, whānau, hapū, iwi.
- 1.2 Relationship of the Māori female ancestor to the original owner(s) is identified to determine land interests.
  - Range whakapapa, tātai, whakaheke, whenua tuku.

**Outcome 2**

Research the history of the acquisition of the land interest during historical periods.

Range 1800-1860, 1860-1940, 1940-1980, 1980-present.

**Performance criteria**

- 2.1 Research details the nature of the Māori female ancestor's acquisition of the land interest.
- 2.2 Research details the enforcement of the Māori female ancestor's acquisition of the land interest.

**Outcome 3**

Research the current status of the land interest of the Māori female ancestor.

**Performance criteria**

- 3.1 Research details the land interest of the Māori female ancestor in terms of the current status.

Range may include but is not limited to – marriage, whānau links, dowry, investment, gift, compensation, succession, sale, purchase, legislation for government acquisition (including local bodies acquisition), confiscation, forced sale; evidence of four is required.
