Guidance Information

- All tasks are to be carried out in accordance with enterprise procedures, the enterprise being the organisation carrying out the work. Enterprise procedures referred to in this unit standard are the applicable procedures found in the following: enterprise exposition; manufacturer publications; Government and local body legislation; airworthiness authority requirements.
- Industry may require the concurrent assessment of Unit 10802, *Control the quality of aeronautical engineering production activities*.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Demonstrate an understanding of legislative demands and enterprise procedures that apply to the aeronautical workplace.

Range in terms of applicability to, and effect on, the activity being carried out.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Airworthiness authority demands applicable to the activity being carried out are identified and analysed.
- 1.2 Enterprise procedures applicable to the activity being carried out are identified and analysed.

- 1.3 Government and local body regulations applicable to the activity being carried out are identified and analysed.

Outcome 2

Ensure compliance with legislative demands and enterprise procedures.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Work activities are monitored to a level that verifies compliance with legislative demands and enterprise procedures.
- 2.2 Non-compliances with legislative demands and enterprise procedures are rectified in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 2.3 Staff are trained in accordance with enterprise procedures to a level that ensures action is taken to preserve life in emergency situations.
- Range first aid, evacuation, fire, natural disaster.
- 2.4 Accidents and incidents are investigated to a level that enables causes to be identified.
- 2.5 Action is taken to prevent recurrence of accidents and incidents in accordance with enterprise procedures.
- 2.6 Procedures that will ensure compliance with enterprise procedures for contractors and visitors to the worksite are implemented.
