 must include any five of – rub rails, roof guttering, bumpers, exterior mirrors, signs, roof vent panels, mudguards and flaps, side skirt, wind deflector, effluent collectors, underside lockers, lights, bike racks, reverse cameras, solar panels, reflectors, awning.
