- 2 Legislation and regulations to be complied with include but are not limited to – Food Act 2014, Health and Safety at Work Act 2015.
- 3 For the purpose of this unit standard, evidence will be required that customers are greeted and treated in all interactions in a polite, friendly and helpful manner.
- 4 Evidence for the practical components of this unit standard must either be gathered in the workplace or in a realistic environment where the candidate has to produce product or similar for customers who have the same expectations for quality and timeliness as a paying customer.

Outcomes and evidence requirements

Outcome 1

Pack food and beverage orders for takeaway in a commercial hospitality environment.

Evidence requirements

- 1.1 Takeaway food and beverage orders are collated in accordance with customer order and establishment requirements.

1.2 Packaging materials for takeaway food and beverage orders are chosen in accordance with establishment requirements.

Range packaging may include but is not limited to – containers, lids.

1.3 Takeaway packs are made up to include the correct service items and accompaniments in accordance with customer and establishment requirements.

1.4 Takeaway food and beverage orders are packed in accordance with customer and establishment requirements.
