Outcome 1

Prepare farm dairy and yards for milking.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Set up farm dairy and yards for milking in accordance with prior instructions of the supervisor and individual plant requirements.
- 1.2 Prepare foot bath and teat sprays in accordance with prior instructions of the supervisor and manufacturer's specifications.

Outcome 2

Get a dairy flock in for milking.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Yard dairy flock without undue stress or injury to any sheep.
- 2.2 Identify abnormal behaviour or activity in sheep and report observations to the supervisor.

Range abnormal behaviour may include but is not limited to – ryegrass

staggers, carrying a leg, out of normal position; evidence of one abnormal behaviour is required.

- 2.3 Set up gates for the flock return according to prior instructions of the supervisor.
- 2.4 Assess and report on paddock conditions, water supply, structures and stock conditions according to instructions of the supervisor.

Outcome 3

Milk dairy sheep.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Bail sheep without stress or injury to sheep.
- 3.2 Check sheep and prepare for milking.

Range checks may include but are not limited to - signs of ill-health,

discoloured or cracked teats, inflamed udders;

evidence of one check is required.

3.3 Milk sheep hygienically without over-milking.

Outcome 4

Isolate milk and sheep unsuitable for collection and follow hygiene practices as directed by a supervisor.

Performance criteria

- 4.1 Identify appropriate sheep for milk isolation from the flock and record in accordance with the system in use.
- 4.2 Isolate unsuitable milk completely from the collection supply.
- 4.3 Follow hygiene practices.

Range practices may include but are not limited to – teat disinfection,

clean cluster, clean isolation equipment; evidence of two practices is required.

Outcome 5

Clean farm dairy and yards after milking and set up for next milking.

Performance criteria

- 5.1 Check filter sock for mastitis indications and report observations to the supervisor.
- 5.2 Clean farm dairy and yards to meet hygiene requirements.
- 5.3 Clean farm dairy safely without risk of damage to equipment or facility.
- 5.4 Set up farm dairy for the next milking.
