- 1.4 Identify examples of species targeted by the fishing methods.

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Outcome 2

Demonstrate knowledge of active fishing methods.

Range two of – trawling, dredging, seining, trolling.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Describe the gear used for the fishing methods.
- 2.2 Describe the deck layout consistent with the fishing methods.
- 2.3 Describe the principles of the fishing methods.
- 2.4 Identify examples of species targeted by the fishing methods.

Outcome 3

Describe commonly used electronic fish finding aids.

Range wheelhouse aids, fishing gear aids;

evidence of seven different aids is required.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Describe the aids by the commonly used names and where the aids are located.
- 3.2 Describe the basic principles of the aids.
- 3.3 Describe the fish finding information the aids can provide.
