Describe tikanga Māori associated with mahinga kai in relation to the selection, and preparation of two kai Māori.

Range may include but is not limited to – karengo, ika, tuna, manu, rākau, hua whenua.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Tikanga Māori associated with the selection of kai Māori are described including conservation considerations of the species.
- 2.2 Tikanga Māori associated with the mahinga kai are described.
- 2.3 Karakia associated with the preparation of kai Māori is identified.
