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Guidance Information

- 1 Where local rohe are also occupied by a number of other iwi or hapū, the tangata whenua or mana whenua view should take precedence. Other iwi or hapū views should be encouraged in order to enrich and enhance understanding of key Māori concepts and practices.
- 2 Assessment against this unit standard can be conducted in a number of ways that may include but is not limited to – oral presentations, visual presentations, written presentations, whakaari, waiata, haka.
- 3 **Range**
Native freshwater fish and shellfish species may include but are not limited to the following – īnanga, taraute, tuna, kōkopu, piharau, paraki, kōwaro, kakahi, kōura, kōuraura, pāpaka.
Native marine fish and shellfish species may include but are not limited to the following – hāpuku, kahawai, kanae, maroro, moki, oraora, pātiki, tāmure, tarakihi, tawatawa, ūpokohue, toheroa, tuatua, pipi, pāua, tuangi, tio, kuku, tipa, pūpū, ngākihi, kina.
- 4 **Definition**
Tikanga Māori refers to appropriate or 'right' ways or practises that are associated with the harvesting and processing of native freshwater fish or shellfish species and marine fish or shellfish species.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Explain one native freshwater and one native marine fish or shellfish species.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Freshwater and marine fish or shellfish species are explained in terms of physical characteristics.
- 1.2 Freshwater and marine fish or shellfish species are explained in terms of habitats.

Outcome 2

Explain the use of one native freshwater and one native marine fish or shellfish species as kai.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 One native freshwater and one native marine fish or shellfish species are explained in terms of aspects of associated tikanga Māori.
- 2.2 Fish or shellfish is explained in terms of their use as kai.

Outcome 3

Explain harvesting and processing of one native freshwater and one native marine fish or shellfish species.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Freshwater and marine fish or shellfish species are explained in terms of harvesting methods.
- 3.2 Freshwater and marine fish or shellfish species are explained in terms of processing methods.
- 3.3 Freshwater and marine fish or shellfish species are explained in terms of tikanga Māori associated with harvesting and processing.
