- 1 Recommended skills and knowledge
Unit 16030, *Describe Māori approaches to historical research*.
- 2 The basic principles underpinning tikanga are common, but while there are some constants, the details of performance of tikanga, and their explanation, may differ. These differences may be at a rohe, iwi, hapū, whānau, or marae level. The context of the learning should include the tikanga of the local mana whenua (if capable), but learning others' tikanga is also encouraged. This is in order to enrich and enhance understanding of tikanga, and the associated reo.

- 5 Learners must describe the same hapū or iwi throughout to meet the requirements of all the outcomes.
- 6 All sources of information must be referenced.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Describe key historical events for one hapū or iwi post-Pākehā contact.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Key events are described in terms of their effects on the hapū or iwi.
- Range events may include but are not limited to – trade, wars, Christianity, loss of land, loss of identity, colonisation.
- 1.2 Key events are described in terms of the attitudes in interactions between the hapū or iwi and Pākehā.
- 1.3 Key events are described in terms of the effects on the social, political, cultural, economic and educational aspirations of the hapū or iwi.

Outcome 2

Describe key historical events for one hapū or iwi up until the end of the Second World War.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Key events are described in terms of the effects on the hapū or iwi.
- Range events may include – war, raupatu, deaths and injury due to war or disease, land loss, lifestyle changes.
- 2.2 Key events are described in terms of the effects of legislation on the hapū or iwi.

Outcome 3

Describe key historical events for one hapū or iwi from the end of the Second World War up until the present day.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Key events are described in terms of their effects on the hapū or iwi.
- Range events may include – urbanisation, claims settlements, employment changes, education changes.
