Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Mount and dismount from a horse.

Performance criteria

- 1.1 Wear clothing that meets riding and safety requirements.
- Range may include but is not limited to – safety helmet; smooth soled, heeled footwear, vest.
- 1.2 Mount the horse lowering gently into the saddle and maintaining control of the horse at all times.
- 1.3 Dismount the horse landing on the ground with both feet simultaneously and maintaining control of the horse at all times.
- 1.4 Use aids to assist with mounting a horse whilst maintaining control of the horse.
- Range mounting block, leg up.

Outcome 2

Ride a horse through the basic school movements demonstrating the use of aids.

Range walk, rising trot, canter.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Use natural aids unobtrusively to control the horse.
- Range seat, leg, voice, hands.
- 2.2 Maintain a steady and correct position in the saddle at all times.
- Range hands, thumbs, lower arm in relation to rein and horse's mouth, heels, lower leg, hip and heel alignment, body pose, head.
- 2.3 Use artificial aids to reinforce leg aids.

Outcome 3

Maintain riding etiquette.

Performance criteria

- 3.1 Maintain riding etiquette when riding on private property.
- Range may include but not limited to – use of gates, obtaining permission, other stock in paddock, minimal damage to land.
- 3.2 Maintain riding etiquette when riding on roads and in accordance with the Road Code.
- Range use of grass verges, traffic.

- 3.3 Maintain riding etiquette when riding in company in terms of safety of other horses, the use of gates, and horses misbehaving.
