- 4 *Accepting the bit* as defined in Lawrence, Kevin, *Pony Club Manual 2* (revised edition) (Havelock North: New Zealand Pony Clubs Association, 2007). The horse going freely forward, calm and attentive, with a steady head and even contact on the bit, accepting all the rider's aids without resentment or evasion'.
- 5 *Natural aids* refer to voice, leg, seat, hands; artificial aids refer to whip, spur.

Outcomes and performance criteria

Outcome 1

Carry out movements on a horse using natural and artificial aids.

Range horse calm and accepting the bit, all paces even, in a rhythm, rider maintaining steady contact using natural and artificial aids.

Performance criteria

1.1 Ride to a rising trot on both left and right diagonal while maintaining a steady and balanced position in the saddle.

- 1.2 Demonstrate a sitting trot with the rider balanced and maintaining an even contact with the horse at all times.
- 1.3 Ride in circles with the horse flexing to the inside of the circle.

Range 10 metres in walk, 15 metres in trot, 20 metres in canter.

1.4 Ride in serpentines and loops in a school situation with the horse supple and responsive.

Range walk, trot.

- 1.5 Demonstrate lengthened strides at a trot on the long side of the schooling arena with the horse balanced.
- 1.6 Demonstrate movements from the walk with the horse balanced, and showing smooth, even strides.

Range halt for three seconds with horse standing square, leg yield on straight line or circle.

- 1.7 Demonstrate change of leg through the trot smoothly and with the horse balanced.
- 1.8 Carry out a gallop with the horse under control at all times.

Outcome 2

Ride a horse over a course of jumps.

Range show jumping fences, cross-country fences.

Performance criteria

- 2.1 Walk the jumping course to establish position and order of fences and number of strides between fences.
- 2.2 Jump a variety of cross-country fences and combinations of fences, maximum height of 80 cm, at a trot and canter, maintaining a steady jumping position.

Range uphill, downhill fences, drop fences, banks, ditches.

- 2.3 Jump and clear a variety of show jumping fences and combinations of fences, maximum height of 80 cm, at a trot and canter, maintaining a steady jumping position.
 - Range uprights, parallels, doubles, spreads, drums.
