# Outcomes and performance criteria

#### **Outcome 1**

Prepare the float or truck for the horse to enter.

## Performance criteria

- 1.1 Describe the features, and differences between floats and trucks for loading, unloading, and the way horses are positioned when travelling.
- 1.2 Check internal and external features of the float or truck for safety.
- 1.3 Prepare partitions for the horse to load.

## Outcome 2

Pack the vehicle with supplies to meet horse and staff personal gear for the duration of the event.

#### Performance criteria

2.1 Identify and pack supplies for the horse's requirements for the duration of time away.

Range supplies may include – feed, equipment.

2.2 Pack equipment and personal gear for travelling personnel.

### **Outcome 3**

Prepare the horse with protective gear ready for travel, and describe the horse's requirements during break stops.

### Performance criteria

- 3.1 Describe the purpose of protective gear used for travel.
- 3.2 Fit protective gear to horse for travel as required.
- 3.3 Describe the horse's requirements during break stops.

# **Outcome 4**

Load the horse on a float or a truck safely in preparation for travel, describe safety considerations, and methods for loading and unloading difficult horses.

### Performance criteria

4.1 Lead the horse up the ramp confidently and secure in the float or truck to prevent backing off, demonstrating safe loading practices.

### **Outcome 6**

Unload the horse from a float or a truck, and report health of the horse.

#### Performance criteria

- 6.1 Safely unload the horse in a methodical manner without injury to horse, equipment or self, demonstrating safe unloading practices.
- Report physical condition of the horse and behaviour to the supervisor.

### **Outcome 7**

Attend to immediate post-travel activities relating to horse and vehicle.

## Performance criteria

- 7.1 Restrain the horse and remove travelling gear.
- 7.2 Store gear in preparation for return journey.
- 7.3 Restore internal part of the vehicle.

Range may include but is not limited to – clean, wash, readjust partitions,

restore ramp position;

evidence of two is required.
